Our congregation is part of an ecumenical ministry helping people in need in our community. Caritas is open once a week on Wednesdays from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. and is based at St. Francis Episcopal Church on Silver Lake Road in Eagle River.

We will try to keep you updated on what the pantry REALLY NEEDS in any given month. Right now, you can be very helpful in providing any of the following items. Smaller sizes are actually better so that more people can be helped.

However, the Sons of Norway support a humanitarian organization that collects used postage stamps, packages and sells them to wholesalers and philatelists around the world. Profits from this endeavor finance tuberculosis research/prevention and provide aid for children affected by this disease. Today cases of TB are again on the rise, and such research is vital. So, please save cancelled stamps. Just cut or tear the stamps from envelopes leaving a slight margin (approximately 1/2 inch) to keep the perforation intact. Stamps from any country can be used. There is a collection box in the coat room.
