Just this past week, standing outside a friend's home on an area lake, I heard a sound that I have not heard in a long time, and it caught me completely by surprise. The call of a male Red Winged Black Bird. Almost hard to believe with all this snow on the ground and more to come, but he did it one more time for me, just to make sure I was not hearing things. Doesn't seem like much, but where I grew up, these birds and the migrating geese, were the first real sounds of spring. They arrived first to stake their claim on the best turf to nest, and raise their young. Regardless of the weather, be it like today, more like winter than spring, you always knew that spring was just around the corner. That out of the dormant dead of winter, new life will once more come forth.

Our Lenten journey was much like a walk through winter, but through it all there were sounds of new life to come. SENIOR MEALS




