FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT

First off all, a big thank you goes out to everyone who made our Polka Service a success, especially Don and Pepper Bauer, our choir and Karen Carter. Plans are already in the works for another Polka service next year.

On Sunday, October 8th Bill, Karen Carter and I attended the Headwaters Conference 3 annual meeting. Shepherd of the Lakes, Pioneer in Conover, Prince of Peace in Eagle River, Faith in Three Lakes, Calvary and Ascension in Minocqua, and Trinity and Immanuel in Rhinelander make up Conference 3 of the Northern Great Lakes Synod. Bishop Finnegan was also in attendance. During the meeting, Karen Carter was elected secretary/treasurer of the conference and Karen and I were elected representatives to the Synod Council. We both look forward to our new responsibilities and will be sure to keep you informed of what is happening at the Synod level.

In my last message to you I mentioned that we had had one resignation from Council that was filled by electing a successor. We have now had a second resignation, which means the Council will again have to elect a successor to serve until our annual meeting in January. At that time the two people who have been selected by the Council will have to be confirmed by the congregation, or an election will have to be held. More details concerning this issue will be provided in the next newsletter.

Another item that will be on the annual meeting agenda is the formation of the Shepherd of the Lakes Church Endowment Fund. The Finance and Insurance Committee will be approving a draft of the governing document in the near future; it will then be given to the Council for approval at their November meeting and will be mailed to the congregation with the annual meeting reports. The congregation can modify or vote to accept the document as written. Once this has been accomplished, Officers and a Board of Directors must be established before a bank account can be opened to accept funds restricted for Endowment use.

As you can see a lot has been happening at Shepherd of the Lakes and will continue to happen, always with God's help. Please pray for our church and for those who have positions of responsibility in it.

MADISON, WI—Confirming an age-old rumor among churchgoers, world-class nutritionists at the University of Wisconsin-Madison's Food Research Institute announced Thursday that any and all food consumed on church grounds or at a church function is exempt from counting toward one's caloric intake for the day.

"We've done numerous exhaustive studies on this and can now say without a doubt that calories consumed at church simply are not absorbed by the body," UW Food Research Institute Lead Nutritionist Philip Reed said at a press event announcing the findings.
