The Coffee Bean Bowl "We are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ." II Corinthians 2:15

Most of you know I am married to a true lover of coffee. So was my son. When Mikkel was in high school, his bedroom always had a pottery bowl filled with whole coffee beans. It permeated his room with a warm, pleasant scent; to me even now that provides me with both a sense of wonderful times and wistfulness.

Scripture also uses fragrances as a reminder. In Hosea, God's forgiveness of Israel is said to be "fragrance like the cedars of Lebanon." And Mary's annointing of Jesus' feet, which caused the house of Mary and her siblings to be filled with the fragrance of the perfume," pointed ahead to Jesus' death.

A couple of notes on this report – this is our financial status as of September 30, 2024. You can see that we had \$123,372 in general giving at this point and we had budgeted for \$140,000 for the year. While the numbers are not finalized yet, as of now we show \$152,000 for the year. As always, your generosity amazes me.

At the same time, the expense report compared to budget (which is not included here) shows that as of September 30th we were \$12,000 under budget and again, while not finalized, the reports show we should end up the year about \$10,000 under budget.

I have called a budget meeting for January 10th which will most likely be completed when you receive this newsletter to set up the budget for 2025.

RECIPE CORNER

Taken from "Feast at the Shepherd's Table", this recipe comes from Evelyn Ahlborn.

SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE

2/3 Stick of butter, divided

3 Cups sweet potato, cooked & mashed

½ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

½ Cup sugar

2 eggs

½ Cup milk

1 Cup walnuts or pecans, chopped

1/3 cup flour

1 Cup brown sugar

Melt 1/3 stick of butter; combine with sweet potatoes, vanilla, eggs, sugar and milk. Pour into a buttered casserole dish. Combine 1/3 stick of butter, nuts, flour and brown sugar and crumble over the top of the potatoes. Bake at 350° for one hour.




